General Situation/Overview:

On January 21, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Washington State Department of Health announced the first case of 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States and in Washington State. As of 3/19/2020 a 24, 48, 72-hour planning projection of the response is being done daily. Friday’s planning projection will encompass Saturday and Sunday, then resume normal planning projections on Monday.

HEALTHY WASHINGTON ROADMAP TO RECOVERY

- Healthy Washington Roadmap to Recovery – On May 13th Governor Inslee announced that all counties will move to Phase 3 effective May 18th – June 30. The state will fully re-open on June 30 or before if we can reach a 70% vaccination rate across the state. One caveat to these re-opening plans is if the ICU capacity reaches 90% restrictions may need to be put back in place. <https://www.governor.wa.gov/news-media/inslee-announces-statewide-reopening-date-june-30-and-short-term-statewide-move-phase%2%A03>
- Governor Inslee also announced on May 13th that Washington would follow the CDC guidelines for masking guidance for fully vaccinated people. Meaning people who are two weeks past their second Pfizer or Moderna shot or one-shot J&J will not be required to wear a mask in most settings. There are exclusions to the mask guidance – like for medical, public transportation, schools, etc. and businesses retain the right to require customers to wear masks.

<p><u>CONTACT TRACING & CARE COORDINATION:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Care Coordination team connects people in Isolation or quarantine to the services they need to stay isolated. This may be providing a Walgreens Hygiene kit or a Kroger Food box or connecting them with rent assistance, grocery or prescription delivery or other services. Care Coordination is averaging about 20 case referrals per day. Metrics for Case Investigation and Contact Tracing Conducted by Washington State Centralized Investigations - May 26, 2021 report.
<p><u>VACCINE PREPAREDNESS:</u></p>

- The Mass Vaccination site at the Benton County Fairgrounds closed on Friday May 28th. The site opened on January 25th providing COVID vaccinations 5 days per week for 18 weeks. The site consistently processed in excess of 750 shots each day, many days going well over 1,000 doses. The highest single day, April 16, 2021, was 2,164 vaccines given out. Maximum throughput was estimated at nearly 300 vehicles per hour. Numbers dropped off over the month of May, but overall, the site provided just over 81,000 vaccinations.
- DOH has launched a new service for mobile COVID vaccinations called “Care-A Van” [Care-a-Van :: Washington State Department of Health](#). BFHD has requested the “Care-A-Van” from DOH to assist with COVID vaccinations at the Pasco Flea Market.
- With the closure of the mass vaccination site, the BFHD vaccine team will be reengaging the COVID Vaccine Provider weekly coordination call.
- BFHD has partnered with Columbia Basin Health Association will provide a vaccination clinic on Sunday at the Pasco Flea Market.
- COVID Vaccination clinic for Lamb Weston on June 3rd from 11 a.m. – noon.
- Beginning June 11th, the CBC West Test Site will provide “drive-thru” COVID vaccinations on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. – All vaccines will be offered (Pfizer, Moderna and J&J)
- BFHD has contracted with Columbia Safety to provide mobile clinics five days a week, Wednesday through Sunday. BFHD identifies locations and coordinates the clinic details with Columbia Safety. For dates without a scheduled clinic, locations are being arranged for recurring “pop-up” clinics in all 4 Cities (Pasco, Richland, Kennewick, West Richland) and rural county sites..
- BFHD is working to ensure that all clinical partners who usually administer childhood vaccinations are ready to re-engage to provide COVID vaccinations to their patients and parents.

- **BFHD working on plans for re-opening of the BFHD facility to the public**
- On May 25, 2021 Benton-Franklin Health District (BFHD) Health Officer, Dr. Amy Person [rescinded local directives: Masking in Public](#) and the “No Mask, No Service in Businesses.” Both directives had been issued last summer to address rising case rates and widespread transmission of COVID-19. With the availability of safe and effective COVID-19 vaccination, COVID-19 disease rates and transmission are improving in Benton and Franklin counties in line with the rest of Washington State. Local masking requirements beyond what is required by Washington State through [Order of the Secretary of Health 20-03.2](#) are no longer necessary.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Return to fulltime in-person learning in schools across the two counties for Elementary Middle and High School students– The governor approved CDC 3 ft distance recommendation – will continue to monitor for outbreaks and impacts from quarantine requirements
