

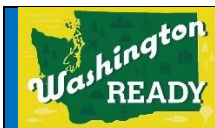
**Event Name: BFHD COVID-19**

**General Situation/Overview:**

On January 21, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Washington State Department of Health announced the first case of 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States and in Washington State. As of 3/19/2020 a 24, 48, 72-hour planning projection of the response is being done daily. Friday's planning projection will encompass Saturday and Sunday, then resume normal planning projections on Monday. On August 17th BFHD transitioned back to a 2-week IAP. The Unified SitRep will be distributed the Friday after. The next IAP will be sent on August 31<sup>st</sup> and SitRep will be September 3<sup>rd</sup>.



- Gov. Jay Inslee today announced a [vaccination requirement](https://www.governor.wa.gov/news-media/inslee-announces-educator-vaccination-requirement-and-statewide-indoor-mask-mandate) for employees working in K-12, most childcare and early learning, and higher education, as well as an expansion of the statewide mask mandate to all individuals, regardless of vaccination status. <https://www.governor.wa.gov/news-media/inslee-announces-educator-vaccination-requirement-and-statewide-indoor-mask-mandate>
- Gov. Jay Inslee today issued an [emergency proclamation](#) mandating that most state executive branch employees and on-site contractors and volunteers, along with public and private health care and long-term care workers, must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by October 18.

## **OPERATIONS SECTION:**

**OUTBREAK MITIGATION & DATA:** Identify the COVID-19 spread, including clusters; track any lab confirmed cases and determine potential exposures. Identify the spread of COVID-19 in long-term care and community living facilities and provide infection control guidance and resources to those facilities. Input data from Epi into existing systems; WDRS and Redcap surveys.

- Weekly cases have increased significantly. Over the last 7 days we had 764 cases, the previous 7 days was 499 cases and previous to that week was 406 cases.
  - Active Outbreaks in the community: these outbreaks meet the definition of an outbreak according to DOH
    - **General Business Community** 20 with 7 pending investigations
    - **Long Term Care Facilities** – 6 with 0 pending investigations
    - **HealthCare Settings** – 1 with 1 pending investigation
    - **Childcare Settings** –0 with 4 pending investigation
    - **Schools** – 0 with 03pending

## **COMMUNITY TESTING:**

- **CBC-West Test Site:** To date the site has administered **118,002 COVID tests**. The 14 day positivity rate at the test site is 21.72%
- **CBC-West Test Site operates 5 days a week, Friday to Tuesday from 8:30am to 4:00pm. The site will be closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays** - pre-registration makes for a faster experience at the test site – however you may still have to wait in line until you reach the point where the site breaks into lanes, please be patient.
