General Situation/Overview:

On January 21, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Washington State Department of Health announced the first case of 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) in the United States and in Washington State. Hospital capacity is reaching limits at this time, planning is being done to protect the healthcare industry. On August 17th BFHD transitioned back to a 2-week IAP. The Unified SitRep will be distributed the Friday after.



- The September epiTRENDS issue has been posted with a review of influenza and vaccines to prevent influenza. Promoting influenza vaccination is particularly important this season to reduce influenza-related healthcare visits and hospitalizations. [EpiTRENDS :: Washington State Department of Health](#)
- Gov. Jay Inslee today announced a [vaccination requirement](#) for employees working in K-12, most childcare and early learning, and higher education, as well as an expansion of the statewide mask mandate to all individuals, regardless of vaccination status. <https://www.governor.wa.gov/news-media/inslee-announces-educator-vaccination-requirement-and-statewide-indoor-mask-mandate>
- Gov. Jay Inslee issued an [emergency proclamation](#) mandating that most state executive branch employees and on-site contractors and volunteers, along with public and private health care and long-term care workers, must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by October 18.

OUTBREAK MITIGATION & DATA: Identify the COVID-19 spread, including clusters; track any lab confirmed cases and determine potential exposures. - Weekly cases have plateaued. Over the last 7 days we had 1544 cases, the previous 7 days was 1511.
- Active Outbreaks in the community: these outbreaks meet the definition of an outbreak according to DOH
 - **General Business Community** 12 with 15 pending investigation
 - **Long Term Care Facilities** – 18 with 3 on watch
 - **HealthCare Settings** – 1 with 1 pending investigation
 - **Childcare Settings** – 0 with 0 pending investigation
 - **Schools** – 2 with 5 pending investigations

CONTACT TRACING & CARE COORDINATION:

- Surge standards are in place for investigating cases in Contact Tracing.
- Care Coordination team connects people in isolation or quarantine to the services they need to stay isolated. This may be providing a Walgreens Hygiene kit or a Kroger Food box or connecting them with rent assistance, grocery or prescription delivery or other services. These referrals are increasing steadily.

VACCINE PREPAREDNESS:

- Working with WSU Nursing students to provide mobile clinics throughout the counties. The Mid-Columbia Libraries have partnered with BFHD to host clinics on 9/24 10-2 located at the W. Pasco library; 10/6 1-5 at Pasco Library; 10/8 9-1 W. Richland Library; 10/12 1-5 pm Kennewick Library.
- Vaccine planning for the 3rd dose is taking place with community partners. Kadlec health plex intends to stand up their large operation again to support the community need. All pharmacies who have Covid-19 vaccine will be providing booster doses.
- BFHD continues to be a depot for small quantity vaccine allocations to local providers. BFHD transferred 11,943 doses to local providers since June 2021 with 6,505 doses occurring in August of 2021.
- 3,290 doses of vaccine have been administered through community pop up clinics via 88 clinics hosted by Kadlec, MTI, TCCH and BFHD.

- The Delta variant accounts for 100% of the cases in Benton & Franklin Counties Our team continues to work with providers on mitigation messaging and offering of vaccinations with patients.
- The Covid-19 Vaccine continues to be the only way to prevent serious outcomes from Covid-19. Monoclonal antibody treatment is incredibly limited in the Benton-Franklin Communities and should not be relied upon to be readily available in the event a person falls ill.

COMMUNITY TESTING:

- **CBC-West Test Site:** To date the site has administered **147,597 COVID tests**. The 14-day positivity rate at the test site is **23.59%**

The site will be closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays - pre-registration makes for a faster experience at the test site – however you may still have to wait in line until you reach the point where the site breaks into lanes, please be patient.
